#### INTRODUCTION

A pall may be placed upon the coffin by the pallbearers or other assisting ministers, and the following may be said.

When we were baptized in Christ Jesus, we were baptized into his death. We were buried therefore with him by Baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

## **GATHERING PROCESSION**

The procession forms and enters the church, the ministers preceding the coffin.

A psalm, hymn, or appropriate verse may be sung as the procession goes to the front of the church.

# OPTION A: O God of grace and glory

O God of grace and glory, we remember before you today our *sister/brother <u>name</u>*. We thank you for giving *her/him* to us to know and to love as a companion in our pilgrimage on earth. In your boundless compassion, console us who mourn. Give us your aid, so we may see in death the gate to eternal life, that we may continue our course on earth in confidence until, by your call, we are reunited with those who have gone before us; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

# OPTION B: Almighty God, source of all mercy

Almighty God, source of all mercy and giver of comfort: Deal graciously, we pray, with those who mourn, that, casting all their sorrow on you, they may know the consolation of your love; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Make us aware of the shortness and uncertainty of human life, and let your Holy Spirit lead us in holiness and righteousness all the days of our life, so that, when we shall have served you in our generation, we may be gathered to our ancestors, having the testimony of a good conscience, in the communion of your Church, in the confidence of a certain faith, in the comfort of a holy hope, in favor with you, our God, and in peace with all humanity; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

O God our Father, your beloved Son took children into his arms and blessed them. Give us grace, we pray, that we may entrust <u>name</u> to your never-failing care and love, and bring us all to your heavenly kingdom; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

One of the following lessons may be read.

# OPTION A: The hour has come for the Son of man to be glorified (John 12:23-26)

And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of man to be glorified. Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. He who loves his life loses it, and he who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there shall my servant be also; if anyone serves me, the Father will honor him." (*John 12:23-26*)

# OPTION B: We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed (1 Corinthians 15:51-57)

Lo! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. For this perishable nature must put on the imperishable, and this mortal nature must put on immortality. When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in a victory." "O death, where is thy victory? O death, where is thy sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 15:51-57)

# OPTION C: But our commonwealth is in heaven (Philippians 3:20-21)

But our commonwealth is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power which enables him even to subject all things to himself. (*Philippians 3:20-21*)

The coffin is lowered into the grave or placed in its resting place. Earth may be cast on the coffin as the minister says:

# OPTION A: In sure and certain hope of the resurrection

In sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ, we commend to almighty God our *brother/sister*, <u>name</u>, and we commit *his/her* body to *the ground / the deep / the elements / its resting place*; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust. The Lord bless *him/her* and keep *him/her*. The Lord makes his face shine on *him/her* and be gracious to *him/her*. The Lord look upon *him/her* with favor and give *him/her* + peace.

# OPTION B: Since almighty God has called

Since almighty God has called our *brother/sister*, <u>name</u>, from this life to himself, we commit *his/her* body to *the earth from which it was made / the deep / the elements / its resting place*. Christ was the first to rise from the dead, and we know that he will raise up our mortal bodies to be like his in glory. We commend our *brother/sister* to the Lord: May the Lord receive *him/her* into his peace and raise *him/her* up on the last day.

Lord, remember us in your kingdom, and teach us to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Lord Jesus, by your death you took away the sting of death. Grant to us, your servants, so to follow in faith where you have led the way, that we may at length fall asleep peacefully in you and wake in your likeness; to you, the author and giver of life, be all honor and glory, now and forever.
