Deuteronomy 16: 9-10

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This passage from the Book of Deuteronomy describes one of the three pilgrimage festivals devout Jews were expected to participate in each year. During each of these festivals they were to bring with them an offering to the Lord God. If possible, they were to travel to Jerusalem, but there were also a number of other designated sites people could travel to if circumstances made travel to Jerusalem unrealistic. In this passage we learn about proportionate giving in relation to the blessings God has given to us. How has God blessed you in 2022?

I have taken time to reflect on the many ways God has blessed me this past year. I have taken time to reflect on how the ministries of Zion St. John, by being the body of Christ, has blessed people in our community, our region and even globally. Here are just a few from the very long list I could name: our music ministries are once again thriving; We have partnered with four other area churches to establish the West Fork Food Pantry that serves the West Fork School District and all of Franklin County; Our Women of the ELCA work very hard to produce quilts, school kits, and hygiene kits that are distributed to those in need through Lutheran World Relief; We have many members that use their time and talents in ways that benefit our congregation and those beyond our walls.

Our Annual Stewardship Emphasis will take place the first three Sundays of November. On these Sundays we will be reminded that we give to God because of what God has first given to us. Consecration Sunday will take place on November 20. On that day you will be invited to make pledges to God for the upcoming year. Some people are reluctant to make a pledge because they are unsure of their income in the next year. That is certainly understandable. Still, I would encourage people in this situation to fill out an estimate of giving card. Then, if your income changes, you can always give less (or more!). My wife Diane and I have found that pledging is an important spiritual discipline for the two of us. I encourage you to come and hear from those giving the Temple Talks. I ask that you prayerfully consider filling out an estimate of giving card and returning it on or around Consecration Sunday.
