


Being the Body of Christ

When the day of Pentecost had come, they (the disciples) were all together in one place. Acts 2:1

For the Jewish people Pentecost is a harvest festival which takes place 50 days after Passover. Pentecost was one of the festivals where the Israelites were encouraged to bring the first fruits of the harvest to the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. Since there were Jewish people living all around the Mediterranean Basin there were people there speaking many different languages. Jesus' disciples were also in Jerusalem for this festival as the Lord had instructed them before He ascended into heaven.

On the day of Pentecost, Jesus' disciples were all in one place. Many believe in the very same place where they had shared the last supper with Jesus. Suddenly the Holy Spirit arrived and the disciples were gifted to speak in languages that they had never learned before. They spilled out of that room into the streets telling people about Jesus. It was a powerful event! The Bible tells us that about 3,000 people were baptized and became Christians that day. Pentecost is considered the Birthday of the Christian Church.

Here's a very interesting correlation. Church attendance is dropping in our country and the number of people feeling hopeless is rising. I believe these two are related. I pray that the Holy Spirit will once again provide an outpouring of the Spirit so that the message of Jesus reaches those that need to hear it.

JAM is our youth group for 5th 6th grade students. One of our members has invited two of his friends that don't have a church home to JAM this year. Bre and I have taught them about Jesus and some of the stories in the Bible. These two kids have attended because their friend speaks their language.

What languages do you speak? Do you speak engineering or nursing or construction? Whatever language you speak I challenge you to be like our young member who invited his friends. As the disciples were all together in one place on that Pentecost, I encourage all of us to be together in one place, here at church, on May 28 and pray together for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit to bring hope to those who have little or none.

I hope to see you on Pentecost, and wear red!

NEIA SYNOD ASSEMBLY

The assembly will take place June 9-10 at Luther College, Decorah, with the theme "Growing Together in Faith, Hope and Love," based on 1 Corinthians 13:13. Saturday's schedule begins at 9 am with morning prayer and includes three plenary sessions, lunch, ministry exhibits and closing worship.

Along with business sessions, there will be three different speakers will present on faith, hope and love — the three emphases of the assembly theme.

This year's synod assembly offering will be designated for the <u>H. George Anderson Fund for Leaders</u> to provide scholarships for seminary students from the Northeastern Iowa Synod and the <u>Bishop's Crisis Fund</u>, which is used at the discretion of the Bishop to directly aid persons within the

synod territory in times of need.

Congregations are invited to bring personal care kits to the synod assembly to support families served through Lutheran Services in Iowa's Early Childhood Services program. LSI Early Childhood Services supports parents of young children to limit the risk of abuse and neglect in the home. Families enrolled in Early Childhood programing often struggle to pay basic needs such as diapers and wipes.



ZSJ will be taking donations for toddler bath kits. Each kit should contain a bath towel, washcloth, baby soap, toddler toothbrush & paste and a bath toy. Please place these items in a two gallon zip lock bag and put in the donation box in the narthex. Our

congregational representatives Pastor Kim, Cindy H and Darwin M will take them to the assembly.



NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER

The National Day of Prayer is a day of religious observance in the US when people are called upon to pray for their country. The first official day of prayer was

in 1775, when the Continental Congress called for the public to fast and pray for the leadership of the Colonies. After that time, Presidents have called the nation to pray during times of war or other hardships. In 1952, Conrad Hilton (founder of Hilton Hotels) and Senator Frank Carlson of Kansas, encouraged by Billy Graham, initiated a bill calling for the President to designate one day a year as a National Day of Prayer. In 1952, President Harry Truman signed a joint resolution into law.

In 1988, Congress chose the first Thursday of each May as the National Day of Prayer, and the bill was signed into law by President Ronald Reagan.

It is biblical and we are blessed to publicly pray for healing, forgiveness, and guidance for our nation and its leaders, now more than ever. This year the National Day of Prayer is Thursday, May 4.

At the January annual meeting, the congregation approved a fundraiser in celebration of our 75th anniversary of this church building. This project would include new flooring in the fellowship hall, kitchen, bathrooms and hallway in the education unit and remodeling of the bathrooms. A \$50,000 fundraising campaign was approved. A generous memorial gift of \$20,000 from Virginia Lease will be used. The project

would be in two phases with the bathroom remodeling first, then the flooring. Our timeline is to do phase 1 this spring and phase 2 this summer. The approximate cost of phase 1 is \$22,000.

We have applied for a few grants to assist with the financing which we should hear about soon. Because of that, we hope that we need to raise around \$14,000 from the congregation in the next 6 months. Total congregational funds raised so far is \$2,206.00. To make your contribution to this worthy project, you can place a check in the offering plate or send to the church and put 75th anniversary in the memo line.

Checking Balance	\$ 9,311


