While I have played only a small part in helping her on her path, we are blessed that Caitlin T is willing to lead worship when I am gone. I am also glad to say that we have had two congregational youth members who have also served as Director of Youth and Family Ministry, Caitlin and Jesse M.

I am also blessed to serve ZSJ with my wife Diane who serves as church secretary and in many other ways. God has blessed our past.


150TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

At the January annual meeting, the congregation approved a fundraiser in celebration of our 75th anniversary of this church building. This project would include new flooring in the fellowship hall, kitchen, bathrooms and hallway in the education unit and remodeling of the bathrooms. A \$50,000 fundraising campaign was approved. A generous memorial gift of \$20,000 from Virginia Lease will be used. The project

would be in two phases with the bathroom remodeling first, then the flooring. Our timeline is to do phase 1 this spring and phase 2 this summer. The approximate cost of phase 1 is \$22,000.

We have applied for a few grants to assist with the financing which we should hear about soon. Because of that, we hope that we need to raise around \$14,000 from the congregation in the next 6 months. Total congregational funds raised so far is \$2,206.00. CONGREGATIONAL SURVEY RESULTS

Last fall the church council prepared a survey and asked our members to respond. We received 49 responses. The purpose of the survey was to determine what we could do to increase in person worship. There were three areas of concern that the council is addressing at this time:

1. Change Time of Service

Change Sunday School and fellowship to 9:00 am with the church service to follow at 10:00 am. Would changing service time or adding a service make a big enough impact on the number of in person attendance?

2. Extra Services


Add a Wednesday evening service There is a conflict the majority of the year with confirmation, bell and choir practice held on Wednesday night.

Have 2 church services each Sunday. One starting at 9:00-9:50, fellowship and Sunday School at 9:50-10:50 and the 2^{nd} service at 11:00-11:50. The concerns with this option is do we have enough hands to hold 2 services, musicians, video, greeters, ushers, lectors, lighting

candles & carrying the cross. It is so nice to be one body worshiping and working together, would two services change that.

3. Sharing of the peace concerns

It is understandable to be nervous about the sharing of the peace. In the past our church has stopped sharing the peace from about November to March during cold and flu season. If uncomfortable shaking hands just fist bump your neighbor or use eye contact and verbally share the peace.

NEIA SYNOD ASSEMBLY

The assembly will take place June 9-10 at Luther College, Decorah, with the theme "Growing Together in Faith, Hope and Love," based on 1 Corinthians 13:13. Saturday's schedule begins at 9 am with morning prayer and includes three plenary sessions, lunch, ministry exhibits and closing worship.



Along with business sessions, there will be three different speakers will present on faith, hope and love — the three emphases of the assembly theme.

This year's synod assembly offering will be designated for the <u>H. George Anderson Fund for Leaders</u> to provide scholarships for seminary students from the Northeastern Iowa Synod and the <u>Bishop's Crisis Fund</u>, which is used at

the discretion of the Bishop to directly aid persons within the synod territory in times of need.

Congregations are invited to bring personal care kits to the synod assembly to support families served through Lutheran Services in

Iowa's Early Childhood Services program. LSI Early Childhood Services supports parents of young children to limit the risk of abuse and neglect in the home. Families enrolled in Early Childhood




programing often struggle to pay basic needs such as diapers and wipes.

put in the donation box in the narthex. Our congregational representatives Pastor Kim, Cindy Hemm and Darwin Meyer will take them to the assembly.


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
