Being in partnership with other churches seems to be one of the themes this past month.

About a month ago I received a telephone call from our Bishop, Kevin Jones. He asked if I would give one of the three keynote addresses at our Synod Assembly. This year's theme was "Growing Together in Faith, Hope and Love". He wanted me to give a presentation on "Growing Together in Faith", based on our partnership with four others churches, regarding our work with The West Fork Food Pantry. I told



him I would be honored to do so, but I wanted my wife Diane to make the presentation with me. We gave the presentation on Saturday, June 10th and it was very well received, as were the other two presentations on "Hope" and "Love."

In our presentation we discussed how growing in faith isn't easy. There are lots of ups and downs, struggles and joys. This really resonated with people. We conveyed the truth that being the church, especially being the church together, isn't easy right now. It isn't easy with church attendance decreasing; with the difficulty some have with co-existing when others have a different point of view; with the clergy shortage. Cindy H, Darwin M, Diane and I all wore our red pantry T-Shirts, and at every break people would come up to us and tell us their stories, as well as thank us for our presentation and our work in the Food Pantry.

Then, just a few days before Synod Assembly, Caitlin T contacted Diane and me, and then our VBS Coordinator Doreen D, about partnering with another congregation on VBS. Caitlin had been in conversation with a woman from St. Paul Lutheran in Hampton who asked her if we would be open to them bringing their kids to VBS at our church.

Doreen contacted the woman from St. Paul's. She told her that

they have resources, that they are willing to share with us in this partnership. Doreen graciously agreed to work with them. At this year's VBS, July 17-20, our threefold cord will actually be a fourfold cord. The strands will include Zion St. John, St. Paul's, Hampton, Ingham Okoboji Lutheran Bible Camp, and most importantly, Jesus Christ.

May God continue to strengthen the ties between our congregations as we seek to be His hands and feet, bringing hope to this hurting world.


150TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

At the January annual meeting, the congregation approved a fundraiser in celebration of our 75th anniversary of this church building. This project would include new flooring in the fellowship hall, kitchen, bathrooms and hallway in the education unit and remodeling of the bathrooms. A \$50,000 fundraising campaign was approved. A generous memorial gift of \$20,000 from Virginia Lease will be used. The project

would be in two phases with the bathroom remodeling first, then the flooring. Phase 1 will begin soon and phase 2 in late summer. As of June 15, our total to \$26,206.00. WELCA GATHERING



The 35th Annual Gathering of the Northeastern Iowa Women of the ELCA was held at Trinity Lutheran Church in Belmond on Saturday, June 17. Those attending from our congregation were Alice G, who serves as vice president, Diane Wills, parliamentarian, Lorna M, voting delegate, and Marcia E. Opening worship with communion was led by Pastor Katie Pals and

Bishop Kevin Jones delivered the sermon, "Stir Us, Free Us," the theme of the gathering.

The business session followed with committee reports, election of officers, including Alice G as vice president, and adoption of two resolutions: one dealing with mental health, and the other approved moving to a biennial convention. Other reports given were about by Mike Knipp from LSI, LWR quilts & kits by Lea N, and happenings at the national level by churchwide representative Laura Krueger.

Interest sessions followed including "Chatting with the Bishop" on any topic participants wanted to discuss. Care of Creation by Donna Rasmussen shared about how this network can assist congregations in creation care efforts, including reducing single use plastics and other disposable products. Karen Samuelson Weltzin, a former member of our congregation, has traveled to the Dominican Republic, Brazil, Uganda and Cuba with the Joni and Friends and Wheels for the World, which provides refurbished wheelchairs to those in need in third world countries. Used wheelchairs in any condition are accepted to be refurbished. Karen helps fit those chairs to the recipients and other volunteers present each with a Bible in their language.

In-kind offerings collected went to Colts Day Care, \$150 in cash and gift cards and 1035 items and Hopes of Wright County, \$350 in cash and gift cards and 201 items. Monetary offerings were \$2920.00 that will be split between church-wide Women of the ELCA and ELCA World Hunger-Bishop's Ride RAGBRAI. Lunch was served by the men of Trinity and St. Olaf before the gathering ended.
