



St John Lutheran was founded in 1875, by a group of German immigrants who made their way from Wisconsin. The original church building was built on a plot of land 3 miles east of town, where the cemetery still stands.

By 1893, there were enough families living west of Sheffield to begin a church in town, which was originally called Peace Lutheran and the name later changed to Zion Lutheran.

The two churches merged in 1948 to form Zion St John Lutheran. This picture is from the 1960's, after the education wing was added (1959). The parsonage was built in 1929, containing 4 bedrooms, kitchen, living area, and office.

When the two churches merged, the altar from the St John church was eventually placed in the church at the Franklin County Fair grounds.



This statue of Jesus was part of a altar purchased by the first Lutheran league in 1908. It was placed in an old shed and found again in 1972, when it was restored and brought to the new church.
