


CHURCH OF THE DAMASCUS RD

PROPERTY UPDATES

We will continue to raise money to complete the flooring in the fellowship hall and kitchen. This part of the project will be completed when adequate funding has been reached. A \$50,000 fundraising campaign was approved at the January annual meeting as part of the recognition of 75 years together in this building. A generous memorial gift of \$20,000 from Virginia Lease is being used. As of October 26, our total is \$40,106.00. TREASURER'S REPORT: As of September 30, there is a checking balance of \$1,926.96 and savings balance of \$2,665.12 of which \$161.72 are designated funds. The funeral cash donations balance as of September 30 is \$369.88. The report was placed on file.

OLD BUSINESS:

- * The Heat and Eat fundraiser will be after church on October 22. Diane will send texts asking for casseroles or soups, as well as people to help put the food into containers. Food will need to be delivered to the church by 10 am on Saturday, October 21. The proceeds for this will be donated to the Fellowship Hall flooring project.
- * Advent by Candlelight will be on Sunday, December 3rd. The same format as last year will be used, with Diane coordinating the program. She will ask Judy Siems to help with the tables again.
- * Holiday Food Fair will be held on Sunday, December 10, following church and then again after the children's program in the afternoon. We will still need to meet on Saturday to price items. We will serve cinnamon rolls for fellowship that day for a free will donation. Half of the proceeds will go to Wings of Refuge, with the other half to the flooring project.

- * Thankofferings are due in November.
- * Installation of new WELCA board members will be January 7th.
- * We picked new salt and pepper shakers to replace the old ones that aren't working very well. Diane will get salt and pepper and we will fill the shakers on October 21.
