
Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday today and forever. Hebrews 13:8

What wonderful news this is for us who live in this age where we are trying our best just to keep up with the changes that we are faced with from day to day. What a gift this truly is!

Our Fall Stewardship theme this year is "Dear Church of Jesus". For the past several weeks we have heard from our members about what Jesus and His church, Zion St. John means to them. A number have shared what they have experienced going back many years. People have shared moments of great joy such as baptisms and weddings. They have also shared moments when they have been brought low by devastating loss and the grief that follows. We still have more letters to read and we will continue to read one letter per Sunday until all who wish to share have been heard.

And then we heard the wonderful news that we were nearing our goal of \$50,000 (utilizing \$20,000 in memorial money given to us the family of Virginia Lease) so that the downstairs bathrooms could be remodeled, and new flooring laid throughout the lower level of the church. On Sunday, November 19 we heard we were at \$48,606 dollars. I am pleased to report that we have now reached our goal!

After worship on the 19th, members of all ages worked together to remove everything from UESUS the fellowship hall and kitchen so the work could IS THE SAME YE begin on Monday. It was amazing to see all the tasks completed in less than 40 minutes! Thanks to everyone who helped. Special thanks to Lance L and Jim B for preplanning where things would be stored. As I write this the week of Thanksgiving, workers are here installing the new flooring. It will be ready to be used by the first week in Advent.



Advent is a season of preparation to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. Advent is also a time to look forward. We look forward to the new year. The flooring project was part of our celebration of being in this church home for 75 years. The upgrades that we have made will serve us well into the future! I think about the ministry that will be done on those new floors for years to come. Every Wednesday they will support the work of our quilters and the study of our confirmation students and occasionally the fun of our JAM students. Every Sunday people gather in the fellowship hall to share a treat and support each other. Every Sunday children will walk on those beautiful floors as they make their way to their Sunday School classes. And then there are the various community groups who use our building as a safe place to gather.

Thank you to everyone who has helped to provide the infrastructure for our future ministries!




TREE DECORATING
