On February 6<sup>th</sup>, I will celebrate the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of my ordination as a minister of word and sacrament. As I reflect on this journey of faith, I am very grateful to my wife Diane and our three children, Christopher, Amanda, and Nick for the sacrifices they made so I could answer God's call. Diane had to leave the two Christian preschools where she taught music, after having established herself as the most sought-after teacher in the Kansas City area. She also gave up a very successful piano studio.

My kids gave up their friends and the school they loved and changed schools five times in four years between our years in seminary, on internship and finally moving to Pella for my first call. These are not small sacrifices.

I have been blessed by the congregations I have served. I served my internship at Our Savior's Lutheran in Stanhope, Iowa. Our monthly stipend there was \$800 per month. But the congregation made sure that we were well cared for. People were constantly dropping off plates of kringla and our freezer was refilled regularly with pork and beef. I will never forget the day the kids came home after visiting the local dentist. They excitedly told me that the dentist there had the latest technology. They said, "rather than using a suction wand he has a round sink that has water swirling around in it and you actually get to spit in it!"

Our first call was at Peace Lutheran Church in Pella, Iowa. We were blessed to be called to a church that was young and growing. While we were there, they began a partnership in Tanzania that has lasted



twenty years. I was blessed to travel to Tanzania to see how they do ministry. Pella was a great place to raise our kids and all three thrived there. Diane had a great job working in both the Pella public and parochial schools.

After 10 years we moved to Sheffield and Zion St. John. Dean and Pauline Peter were instrumental in getting us the opportunity to interview here. I was very impressed with the members of the call committee.

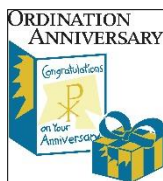
In April I will celebrate serving here for 15 years. Together we have accomplished a great deal in that time. So many improvements to our building and we have continued the congregation's traditions of strong music and educational ministries and establishing and sustaining ministries which serve those in need through the founding of the West Fork Food Pantry.

What I like best about serving here are the people in our congregation. When people arrive on Sunday morning they are happy to see each other. The laughter and the conversations continue after worship in the entry way and down in the fellowship hall.

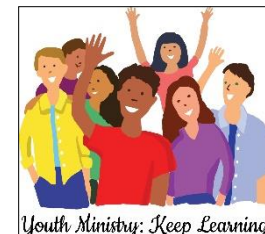
## ORDINATION CELEBRATION

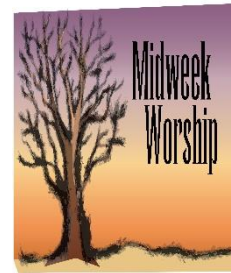


## ASH WEDNESDAY

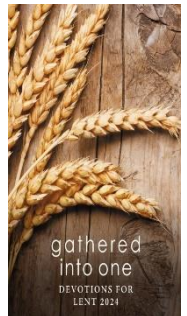
## MIDWEEK WORSHIP

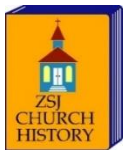
## LENTEN SUPPERS

**CALL TO ORDER:** Chair Alice G called the board meeting to order on Thursday, January 18, 2024, at 4:00 p.m. Present were Alice G, Diane W, and Pam M.

**MINUTES:** Motion by Diane, second by Alice to approve the October meeting minutes, carried.

### **CORRESPONDENCE:**

Thank yous for monetary donations were received from: Caring Pregnancy Center, YSS, Northern Lights Alliance for the Homeless Shelters, LAMP Ministry Inc., Lutheran Services in Iowa, MercyOne North Iowa Hospice, Women of the ELCA, and Lutheran World Relief. Thank yous were also received from Eleanor M and Lindy M for the fleece throw and handmade Christmas cards.

### **TREASURER'S REPORT:**

⇒ As of December 31, there is a checking balance of \$1,039.39 and savings balance of \$2,736.13, of which \$136.72 are designated funds, and \$369.88 are funeral/ event cash donations. The report was placed on file.

⇒ The audit committee reviewed the treasurer's records earlier this month.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

⇒ Shut In gifts of a fleece throw were delivered before Christmas, along with handmade cards.

⇒ Holiday Food Fair profits were \$1,264. Half was given to Wings of Refuge and half to the flooring project.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

⇒ Lenten Supper: Ash Wednesday is February 14 this year. We are planning to serve the supper on Wednesday, March 20. The menu will be beefburgers, relishes, chips, and a bar.

⇒ World Day of Prayer – Zion Reformed is hosting this year. We don't have specific details yet but it will be March 2<sup>nd</sup>.

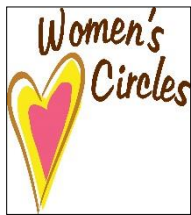
⇒ Bold Women Sunday will be February 25<sup>th</sup>.

⇒ Rejoice and Renew Weekend at EWALU will be held February 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>.



- ⇒ Care Center Birthdays will be April 15 and October 21.
- ⇒ Pie Sale will be held on Sunday, February 11. Members will be asked to donate pies in disposable pie tins, to be delivered to the church by Saturday, February 10th. Prices will be the same as for 2023: \$4 per slice, or \$20 per whole pie. We are requesting pre-orders when possible. Diane will include an order form in the bulletin and newsletter.

- ⇒ Alice adjourned the meeting at 5:10 p.m.

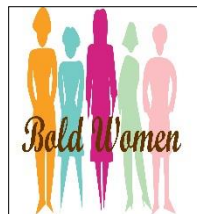

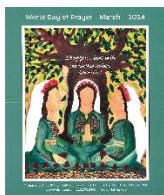
## BOLD WOMEN SUNDAY

## WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

This year's World Day of Prayer Celebration will be held @ Zion Reformed Church on Saturday, March 2, 9:30 am. There will be a program based on the Women of Palestine, singing from the Sheffield Philharmonic and



light refreshments. World Day of Prayer is a worldwide, ecumenical movement of Christian women who come together to observe a common day of prayer each year. It includes women from 170 countries using prayer as a powerful tool given to us by Jesus.



**Call to order:** President Jim B called the annual meeting of Zion St. John Lutheran Church to order at 10:00 AM on January 21, 2023. A quorum was declared. Devotions were led by Pastor Kim Wills.

### Review of 2023 Reports:

- ⇒ **Membership/Attendance Statistics** (p. 6) – 505 Baptized members, 406 Confirmed members. While working on the church directory, Diane contacted members for pictures and updated their membership status at that time so there were more changes in membership than usual.
- ⇒ **Secretary's Report** (p. 7-8) Motion was made by Darwin M to approve the report. Motion was seconded and carried.
- ⇒ **Treasurer/Financial Secretary's Report** (p. 8) Report was reviewed. Total giving for 2023 was \$203,217.98. Ending checking account balance was \$20,990.92 and ending savings account balance was \$73,543.67.

**Pastor's Report** (p. 9) Pastor thanked the council members who finished their term (Doug D, Darwin M and Dacia S). Pastor expressed his appreciation for ⇒ everyone that helped with the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary project to update the flooring and bathrooms in the basement. It was a huge project to get done in one year and with all the support from the congregation it went well. Pastor thanked Lorna for continuing to do a great job working to keep the church clean. He also thanked Scott and Fred for their help with the technology in the church and keeping things running smoothly. He was very thankful for the work Bre has done and that she was here for another year. Pastor was especially thankful for all of Diane's work this year and her extra work on the church directory.

- ⇒ **Director of Youth and Family Ministry's Report** (p. 10) Bre was thankful for how supportive the church has been.

⇒ **President's Report** (p. 9) Jim said thank you to everyone for giving toward the anniversary project and also helping meet the budget needs for the church throughout the year.

⇒ **Audit** - Cliff C, John L and Daren M reviewed the financial reports. All accounts were good.

⇒ **West Fork Food Pantry** – p. 19-20 Diane noted that there is a large balance, but they will be paying for the new walk-in freezer which is a great addition for the food pantry.

⇒ **Church Council** – Three members needed for 3-year terms. Daren M, Nancy R and Scott S were nominated. A motion to accept the nominations, Ron P; second; carried.

⇒ **Cemetery Financial Officer**- Dave S agreed to continue. A motion to approve the nomination, Daren M; second; carried.

⇒ **Nominating Committee**- Three outgoing members will be on the nominating committee: Jim B, Vickie B and Eugene S. Two congregational members are yet to be filled.

⇒ **Legacy/Memorial Committee**- Kathy M was nominated by Marcia E and Jill C was nominated by Dave S. Nomination was approved.

⇒ **Audit Committee** – Doreen D was nominated and approved.

#### ⇒ **Voting Members**

**Riverside Bible Camp**- Darwin M agreed to continue as the representative. Approved.

**Synod Assembly** – There will be no Synod Assembly this year as it was decided to move to a biannual format.

#### **Old Business:**

⇒ Diane W presented a request to close the Parish Education account that has been dormant for 3 years. The funding for Parish Education comes from the annual budget. The account has \$3783.79 in it. A motion to close the account and move the funds to the Youth and Family savings account to be used toward the National Youth Gathering, Scott C; second; carried.

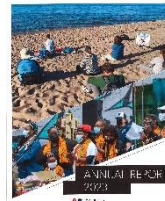
#### **New Business:**
