Synod Assembly used to be an annual event, but will now be a biannual event. Something has been added for those "inbetween" years. This event is the Creative Collaborative Congregations Ministry Fair or, as it will be more commonly referred to, C3.

The initial event will be held at Wartburg College in Waverly, Iowa on Saturday, June 1. The Ministry Fair will include more than 20 workshops on a wide variety of topics. Diane and I have been asked to lead a workshop on Food Pantries and Food Rescue. Our workshop is entitled: "Jesus said, you feed them. How?" It will be offered twice, one in the morning and again in the afternoon. Diane and I will also be leading a table discussion on food pantries during lunch.

I am very excited that our Synod is offering this event. When I served in Southeastern Iowa they had a similar event entitled: "Congregations Together in Mission (CTIM). This was a great way for congregational volunteers to learn what other churches are doing and get some ideas to take back home with them. It is also a wonderful way to meet people from other congregations who share similar interests.



The event begins at 9:00 a.m. Everyone who goes will be able to attend two workshops in the morning. After a break for lunch (a box lunch will be provided) you will be able to attend two workshops in the afternoon. Our time together will end with a worship service and will conclude at 3:45 p.m.

C3 MINISTRY FAIR

All congregation members from the Northeastern Iowa Synod are invited to attend the synod's first "Creative Collaborative Congregations (C3) Ministry Fair" Saturday, June 1, at Wartburg College, Waverly. This new event is an opportunity for lay people, pastors and deacons from across the synod to gather in fellowship, learn together, share



ideas and get inspired with skills to strengthen their congregational ministries. This year's Ministry Fair will happen in alternating years with Synod Assembly. The ministry fair will feature a variety of workshops, round table discussions and displays to support congregations in their ministries and administrative activities. Everyone will be able to attend two workshops in the morning beginning at 9 a.m. and two in the afternoon, concluding at 3:45 p.m. Check-in for the fair will begin at 8:30 a.m.

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER

The National Day of Prayer is a day of religious observance in the US when people are called upon to pray for their country. The first official day of prayer was in 1775, when the Continental Congress called for the public to fast and pray for the leadership of the Colonies.



After that time, Presidents have called the nation to National Day of pray during times of war or other hardships. In 1952, Conrad Hilton (founder of Hilton Hotels) and Senator Frank Carlson of Kansas, encouraged by Billy Graham, initiated a bill calling for the President to designate one day a year as a National Day of Prayer.

In 1952, President Harry Truman signed a joint resolution into law.

In 1988, Congress chose the first Thursday of each May as the National Day of Prayer, and the bill was signed into law by President Ronald Reagan.

It is biblical and we are blessed to publicly pray for healing, forgiveness, and guidance for our nation and its leaders, now more than ever. This year the National Day of Prayer is Thursday, May 2.

- We decided to send a donation of \$250 to the Synodical Women's Organization and \$250 to Katie's Fund used for women's educational scholarships and grants.

- The next WELCA board meeting will be held May 5th. Unless unexpected items come up, we will meet again on August 4th.
