

The 2024 ELCA National Youth Gathering will be held July 16 to July 20 in New Orleans, Louisiana. Zion St. John will have four youth and

two adults attending this event, Keira Huling, Jensen Robbins, Adam Tauro and Claire Tauro and sponsors Brandy Huling and me. ZSJ has a long history of sending youth to these events. The NYG has been a mountain top experience for those who have attended.

At the gathering the youth and sponsors meet each evening at a large sports arena to hear amazing speakers. At one of the past gatherings I was blessed to hear Archbishop Desmond Tutu from South Africa speak. Our youth will also learn about the local ministries in that area. At the end of the evening one of the top contemporary Christian musicians in our country puts on a concert.

During the day the youth will either be involved with hands on service projects, spend time in the interaction center, or participate in activities with other youth from our Northeastern Iowa Synod.

The cost of such a trip is not cheap. We estimate the total cost of attending to be a little over \$2,000 per person; about \$12,500 total. So far, we have about \$9,000 in hand. We will be holding four fundraisers in the next few weeks to bridge this gap.

We will be playing Bunko on Saturday, June 1. The flamingos will be descending on Sheffield soon after that. We will have an ice cream social later in June. In early July we will hold a pie auction after worship one Sunday.

I encourage you to participate in these fund raisers, or if you prefer, you can give us a donation. Please make checks payable to ZSJ Youth.

The impact of the gathering will have a lasting effect on the faith of our youth. Our congregation has a history of being very generous, for that I am very grateful.

C3 MINISTRY FAIR

TREASURER'S REPORT: As of April 30, there is a checking balance of \$1,952.26 and savings balance of \$2,737.49, of which \$136.72 are designated funds, and \$541.83 are funeral/ event cash donations. The report was placed on file.

OLD BUSINESS:

♦ Graduation will be May 19. There are eight graduates this year. Diane has ordered the cake for the reception. The quilters have quilts ready for the graduates.

- ♦ The last day of quilting was April 24. Quilts will be sent on May 18.
- ♦ Alice is checking into more information on the "Looney Lutherans" comedy group. We could possibly incorporate their performance with the 150th anniversary celebration.
- ♦ Registration for the June 15th Gathering in Waverly is now open. Registrations must be postmarked by May 20. We still need a voting delegate.

NEW BUSINESS:

- ♦ The list of needed in-kind offering items for the June gathering has changed, since the residential part of Bremwood is closing. Alice will get the list of new items to Diane.
- ♦ The WELCA General Meeting will be held in September. An item we feel is worth considering for next year's budget is to raise Christmas donations back to \$75, which is where they were prior to Covid.
- ♦ The next WELCA board meeting will be held August 4th, unless unexpected items come up before then.
- ♦ Alice adjourned the meeting at 11:35 a.m.
