## **OUR VISION STATEMENT**

At Zion St. John Lutheran Church, we are committed to being the body of Christ until He returns. Led by the Holy Spirit and gathered around God's Word and Sacraments, we join in worship, fellowship, learning, spiritual nurture, outreach, and service, as we grow in faith and invite others to experience Christ's presence.

One of the hats I wear is dean of our Three River Conference. One of the responsibilities of that job

is to attend quarterly meetings with the synod bishop. At these meetings the main thing we do is get updates on what is going on in the churchwide office and what the synod is working on. Our bishop is also eager to hear how things are going in the congregations in our conference.

At the May meeting one of the updates we received was on seminary graduation and enrollment rates, especially as they relate to congregations who are seeking to call a pastor or deacon. This past year our seminaries graduated a total of 144 candidates who are seeking a call. The number of full-time openings in the ELCA is approximately 260 and part-time vacancies is around 240. That is 500 openings and

144 people to fill them. Unfortunately, this situation, is going to get worse before it starts to improve. The number of students enrolled in seminary for this fall is 125. Beyond that, the estimated number of pastor's that will retire this year alone is 600. The number of retirements is expected to stay right around that level for the next 10 years.



The bottom line is this: We need more people to prayerfully consider entering the ministry. We need people of all ages. Our synod is working very hard on finding ways to train lay people to serve congregations in our synod. That will alleviate part of this issue. But not all of it. I believe congregation members will need to be trained to take on responsibilities that are normally done by pastors. Member visitation is one of them. Administration could be another.

I informed the Bishop and Pastor Steve Brackett, who oversees finding call candidates, that I am currently the only full time ELCA pastor in Franklin County. Everyone sitting in that meeting was stunned by that statement. Hopefully, some of the vacancies in our area will be filled soon. Given this situation, it is very important that moving forward we partner well with the other congregations in our area. As our bishop stated so well at that meeting, "The Holy Spirit has a plan to provide for our pastoral needs, we just don't know exactly what it is yet."

If you feel a call to serve God's people, I would love to talk with you about that. If you know young people who are looking for a career that has excellent job security, please tell them about our need for pastors and deacons.
