Upon our arrival in New Orleans we explored Jackson Square, giving us time to decompress from our flight and bond with one another. We went on a ghost tour later that night where we saw "touchdown Jesus" and heard ghost stories. It was a relaxing day preparing ourselves to be open to new people, experiences, and Jesus. We finished each night with a final 15 and a prayer.

Tuesday morning, Pastor and I got everyone registered and I had the opportunity to sit in on a chaperone meeting. This meeting helped me realize the time and effort put into this trip by Pastor and Brandy Huling. That afternoon we were able to go on a swamp tour where we were allowed to hold a baby alligator. Tuesday night was the opening night for mass gathering, filled with music, dancing, and speakers. We spent time bonding with each other and Jesus. It was truly breathtaking the first time we could hear all 16,000 of us coming together to sing our praises.



Wednesday was spent at the interactive center where the boys spent the majority of their day playing gaga ball with new friends. Keira and I explored the creative center and added our thoughts to a long poem created just for the gathering. The day ended at the mass gathering with more singing, dancing, and speakers. We bonded with other children of God going though the same exact thing that we were. We were able

to communicate without fear of judgment, and talk about how our faith is doing. We discussed the difficulties of being a Christian and ensuring that we keep Jesus close. This was one of the most beneficial days of the trip for me as we shared ideas of what we can do to make sure we do not lose sight of our faith, especially as the fall brings many new beginnings for me.


Thursday we helped families in need after a natural disaster by preparing flood buckets with supplies and then blessing them. Although we laughed and enjoyed our service time, we were able to keep the seriousness of our service project. We were able to reflect on where we were and how we could help others who weren't as fortunate as us. Mass gathering concluded the night with more singing, dancing, and speakers.

Friday was synod day where we had a smaller service with our synod as well a boat tour. On the tour, we were able to try some local

New Orleans favorites such as gumbo and rice and beans. This filled me with the realization that we are not the only youth from our area. It was cool to see how many of the 16,000 people were from our synod and it made me feel less alone in my faith. Again we ended the evening with even more singing, dancing, and speakers at the mass gathering.

Saturday early morning we had closing worship where we were chosen to help with communion. That evening, we were blessed with time with other youth, reflecting and sharing our highs and lows of the week filling me with happiness, but also fear. Being surrounded by 16,000 other people who believe the same things is magical, and it makes it easy to talk about my faith and our God. As we said our goodbyes, I realized that it won't be this simple when we're back to our everyday lives. However, this trip taught me ways to make sure that I keep true to myself. One way was to create a group chat with everyone in our hotel. We send daily prayers, songs, and bible verses, giving us a community to turn to if we are finding it hard to walk with Jesus.

I wholeheartedly believe that every youth in our congregation, and every other congregation, should be able to have this experience at least once in their life. The friends that turn into family, and the growth in my relationship with God will follow me throughout my life. I would like to personally thank every one of you that helped make this trip possible for us. I would like to leave you with a verse from Jeremiah 29

Here's a look at our finances as of July 31, 2024:



Items Working On

- * Attended National Youth Gathering in New Orleans.
- * Vacation Bible School
- * Prayed the opening prayer at Relay for Life.
- * Provided In home Communion to those who requested it. Items to Consider
- * Diane needs a new office chair. The arm fell off and can't be fixed. Cost should be \$150 to \$250 to replace. Council suggested using the chair in the Jericho room.
- Caitlin Tauro has received her entrance approval from the Synod and has begun her duties at St. Paul Lutheran in Hampton. She will begin her studies at Wartburg Seminary in September. Recommendation that we * start sending our monthly missionary support, approximately \$184/ month to Wartburg Seminary designated for Caitlin beginning September 1.
- * Jim Bushkofsky will lead worship on August 18.
- * Pastor will be on vacation August 15-22. This is a no-refund trip, so he is unavailable those dates. He will be out of town September 4-5. Pastor Kim and Diane are returning Leader Dog puppy Stryder on Monday, September 23 and they will be returning home on Saturday, September 28.

- * Discussion on new exterior lighting for the west side of church. Council will request that this project be placed on Memorial list.
- * Murphy's Plumbing and Heating was called for sanctuary air conditioner. It was freezing up and a new computer motherboard was replaced. Freon was replaced and we will monitor its use.
- * The bell was removed Friday August 9th. It has been stored in the garage. Members were able to inspect it after worship. Lance has taken photos of it and discussed initial repairs with the bell company. Tuck pointing will be done the week of August 11th. To date over \$6,800 has been raised toward our \$10,000 goal.
- * The fire extinguishers were inspected and recertified.
- * Our boiler was inspected and was passed. Recommendations were to install a CO monitor and to monitor low water cutoff.
