If Lutherans had a history month it would definitely be the month of October. Because Luther, inspired by these two verses from Ephesians and other verses from Romans, found a gracious God, changing his life and the lives of countless others. On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther posted a document called the 95

Theses, on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. This document contained issues he had with the Roman Catholic Church. Among them was the selling of indulgences, literally the selling of salvation. Money was needed to build St. Peter's Cathedral in Rome, so the Pope authorized the selling of plenary indulgences. If you bought one, (they weren't cheap!), it said no matter what sins you committed, those sins would be forgiven and you would obtain entrance into heaven. Sins up to and



including murder! Martin Luther took exception to this. Salvation is not for sale. It is a free gift from God. And no Pope, or pastor decides who is given entrance to heaven. It is Jesus Christ, who is seated at the right hand of the Father, who will come again to judge the living and the dead.

According to Wikipedia, there are over 800 million Protestant Christians in our world today. They belong to many denominations, but their roots go back to Luther's bold move. This movement would never have caught fire if not for the recent invention of new technology, the moveable type printing press. This allowed the 95 Theses to be copied and carried all over Germany and beyond. When I attended Wartburg Seminary at Dubuque, there is a German saying carved into the limestone of Luther Hall. The English translation is, "God's Word and Luther's teachings stand now and forevermore!" Join with me in celebrating our rich heritage during October, Lutheran History month!

FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP


Here is a look at our finances as of August 31, 2024:


to join the ZSJ group, let Diane know by October Sunday Oct 13.

- * The Heat and Eat fundraiser will be held after church on October 20. The proceeds will go towards replacing the kitchen countertops.
- * The Holiday Food Fair will again be held on a Sunday in December. The proceeds will be split with 50% going toward replacing the kitchen countertops, and 50% to give to Pastor to be used to help those who call the church requesting help with gas.
- * Advent by Candlelight is still being considered.
- * Pennies for Poverty will be donated to Wings of Refuge.
- * There will not be a synodical women's gathering this summer, but there will be some activities throughout the year. Pastor's Report

- * Funerals performed- Wednesday, August 28, Pam H, @ ZSJ
- * Funerals scheduled- Friday, September 20, Cora R, Our Saviors, MC
- * Preparing for Fall Programming
- * Working to fill the vacant Director of Youth & Family Ministries
- * Providing In home Communion to those who request it.
- * Cindy Hemm has volunteered to direct Chancel Choir. Motion to approve, Eugene; second, Daren; carried.
- * Discussion held regarding Pastor's benefits. Pastor is going to do some more research.
- * Pastor has seen an increase in the number of requests for traveler assistance. Pastor currently fills the person's gas tank up to \$50. Council encouraged pastor to meet with Sheffield Police Department and other churches in the area to see what they are doing. Council agreed that Pastor could go ahead and continue with his current process in the meantime.
- * Katy Flint, county auditor, asked if ZSJ could be used as an alternative emergency election site. After discussion, council agrees that the church could be used as an alternative emergency election site. Gene Sheriff also recommended that the West Fork Food Pantry could be used as well.

Secretary's Report- Motion to approve the report, Gene; second, John Latham; carried.

Treasurer's Report- The report shows a short for August expenses. Last two weeks have been good offerings.

Bell Report by Lance

- * Costs already incurred: Tuck pointing \$1,500; Removal of bell \$1,500; Return bell to tower \$1,500.
- * Possible costs from Verdin Bell Company

Clapper rebuild, \$4,600

New bell wheel, \$3,200

New A-frame, \$3,200

Trip charge, \$3,000 each way Bearings and pulleys may need to be fixed

- * Options Lance does not feel that we need a new bell wheel or a new A-frame. Fred Retz has volunteered to transport the bell.
- 1. Fix the clapper + trip charges, \$10,600. We could try to tighten the bolts that hold the bell to the yoke and put the bell back up.
- 2. We could do nothing and return the bell to the tower.
- 3. We could buy a different bell (a quick Google search by Daren revealed a used bell in the \$150,000 range and a new bell in the \$300,000 range).
- * The motion passed at the congregational meeting stated that the bell would be removed, the tuck pointing completed, and then another meeting would be held to determine what steps would be taken.
- * Congregational meeting scheduled for Sunday, September 22nd following worship. Pastor will send out emails to notify the congregation.

Camera Update by Scott Conlon

- * The cost to update cameras used for Livestreaming would be approximately \$2,600.
- * One camera has already been donated.
- * Two cameras were utilized today with improvement in the Livestream.
- * Scott would like to see one camera to be used in the balcony and one camera placed next to the altar on the lectern side. Discussion about if the altar would be an appropriate place for the camera.
- * Scott suggested doing a trial of putting the camera on a tripod to see how it works and what the congregation says prior to running the wires.

- * Air conditioner Pastor will be meeting with Murphy's to discuss the functionality of air conditioners. Pastor feels that it may be related to the placement of the air conditioner outside, as the problems only occur with that air conditioner that is in the sun and not protected. The other two air conditioners do not appear to have the same problems.
- * Diane's office chair Diane will try the one in the Jericho room. If that doesn't work for her, a motion to purchase a new office chair, Daren; second, John L; carried.
- * Boiler Passed inspection. Pastor will place a carbon monoxide detector in the boiler room. The relief test must now be done twice a month instead of monthly.


