The sanctuary is always beautiful and adds to my joy. To see the children tell the story of Jesus birth at the Christmas program (December 15th at 4 pm). To see the excitement of the kids at the 5:00 pm Christmas Eve service and to hear the beautiful music at the 10:00 pm service. The church where I grew up didn't have Christmas Day services, but both of my calls have been to churches that have this tradition. I have grown to appreciate these services pondering the mystery of the Word made flesh. God's greatest gift of love for you and for me.

FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

Here is a look at our finances as of October 31, 2024:

Budgeted Income	\$186,225
Offerings Received	\$155,873
Current Deficit	\$ 30, 352
Total Expenses	\$168,485
Checking Balance	\$ 4,446



The good news is that our budget deficit only grew by \$1,300 and our checking account balance only dropped by just over \$1,000! Please prayerfully fill out and turn in a pledge card for 2025 if you have not already done so. The council is working hard on the budget for 2025. Our insurance company informed us that if we want to renew our policy with them, our rate would jump from \$9,000 to \$35,300. That is not a misprint. The council is working hard to get quotes from other insurance companies and we are working with our current company to find a more reasonable rate. Please pray that God will guides us in this endeavor.

As the end of the year draws near, please prayerfully consider giving on or before December 31, 2024 so your giving can be used as a tax deduction.



Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's report was review and discussed.

- ⇒ New Savings Accounts: Kari M has the authority to open savings accounts for the 150th Anniversary and for the Bell Tower Funds. Once these accounts have been opened, the officers of the church council will need to go to the bank and sign the signature accounts. These accounts should be opened following the annual meeting, as the signature cards need to be signed annually after the annual meeting.
- ⇒ Memorial Account: Lorna M should be added to the memorial account, as she is now the treasurer of the memorial committee.
- ⇒ Motion to approve the opening of the two new savings accounts by Kari M and having Lorna M added to the Memorial Committee bank accounts, Eugene; second, John; carried.

Pastor's Report

⇒ Sunday School Christmas Program_– The West Fork school district planned a school concert on the same day and time as the Sunday

School Christmas Program. Pastor Kim called and talked with the superintendent. The school has moved the concert to the evening. Pastor would like members to contact the school and let them know that the scheduling of school events on Sundays is unacceptable.

- ⇒ Church Insurance: The cost of the church's insurance has increased from \$9,500 to around \$35,000. Pastor has been in contact with the current insurance company, Church Mutual, to determine why there was such large increase in the insurance cost. He asked the insurance company to refigure the costs using different deductible and co-insurance amounts. Jim has been in touch with State Farm to get a quote as well. Pastor will keep the council informed about the progress on this.
- ⇒ Update on Funds from Pam H: The church has been notified that Pam Harvey has donated some of her investments to the church. Pastor and Jim have been working through this process. They are not yet sure of the total amount. This money is not a memorial. It is a gift and does not have any stipulations as to how it is used.

Secretary's Report: Motion to approve the Secretary's Report as presented, John; second, Pastor Kim; carried.

- ⇒ Staff Christmas Gifts: Discussion had regarding gifts and the best way to give the gift to the staff. Jim and Vickie will talk with Kari and take care of getting the gifts.
- ⇒ Annual Meeting Date: January 19, 2025 with alternate date of January 26, 2025.

- ⇒ No Council Meeting in December




