The new cranberry hymnal does not include every song that is in the green LBW, but it contains several wonderful new hymns. Many we have already sung because we have access to them through the Sundays and Seasons software we purchase through our publishing house Augsburg Fortress. The good news is that all the hymns in the LBW are available to us through this software, so we can still include our favorites in the order of worship from time to time.

I thank God every day for the gift of music. It makes my life

richer and improves my mental health. I am thankful for the songs of the church, that enhance our ability to worship God.




