


If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it..

I Corinthians 12:26


from the basement. All ages are welcome to come and help, since many hands makes for lighter work for all! Please contact Al N with questions or to help!

BEING PRESENT

Have you ever eaten a meal with someone who was busy scrolling on her cell phone while (half-heartedly, perhaps) participating in the meal? Or maybe you've been in a meeting or Bible study — inperson or online — where a participant's attention was on her phone and not on the group's discussion? That "present-but-not-really-present"

phenomenon isn't limited to situations involving a cell phone.

The opposite phenomenon is being present in the moment. Your own agenda is of no immediate consequence when you are present in the moment. You are there, listening to and focusing on the friend across the table. You are there, giving your full attention to the family member on the other end of the phone. You are there, setting aside your worry over what has happened or what might happen. You are there,



just as Mary sat at the Lord's feet, hanging on every word that Jesus spoke. You are present.

It is hard and holy work to be present. We see Jesus in one another, don't we? Then we want to be like Mary, hanging on every word.

- ➤ WELCA request regarding countertop project. They would like to use \$6,000 in funds from the Pam Harvey Estate gift as matching funds. The fundraising would begin after all 150th Anniversary Projects are fully funded. A decision would be appreciated by the women as soon as possible.
- We received a call from Franklin Co. Attorney Andrea Miller. They would like an estimate on the replacement value of the bronze marker on the fence that was stolen. I'm not sure how to get that. The sentencing for one of the perpetrator's is coming up soon. We can send a representative if we want to, "to express our feelings about this loss.
- ➤ We received a letter from the Franklin County Assessor's Office addressed to the German Evangelical Lutheran Church. We may need to hire an attorney to get the name of our church corrected. Do we have approval to proceed with this?
- We need to complete an evaluation for Leah Cruz.
- > Consider putting part of our savings into a CD.


