


Do not be afraid; for I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the City of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. Luke 2:10

When it comes to treasured stories from our congregation's past, one of my favorite ones involves the Christmas sacks that were given to the kids following the annual Christmas program. Back in the early 1900's, these sacks included a variety of candies and included fresh fruit, such as apples and oranges. From what I've gathered, what the kids received in those sacks back then isn't all that different from what our kids receive today.

But back then, obtaining fresh fruit out of season was both difficult and very expensive. The bags were assembled then, as they are now, the day before the Christmas program. The bags were so valuable, that one of the male members of the church was appointed to spend that night in the church guarding the bags as they were afraid someone would break into the church and steal them. I wonder if anyone ever tried to break in and steal those bags? Back then those bags were a very valuable gift. One of our members, who now resides in heaven, was always thrilled if we had an extra bag left over so she could have one, as it reminded her of her childhood.

One of the reasons this story means so much to me is that it is full of irony. The most valuable gift in the church isn't the treat bags. The most valuable thing was the message of Christmas that the children learn and share with the adults, that God loved us enough to save us from ourselves. God sent Jesus in the form of a small vulnerable child to show us how to live, how to love and even how to die. The Sunday School children of our



congregation will present their program on Sunday, December 14 at 4:00 p.m. A light supper will be served following the program. I encourage you to come and hear the wonderful story again, to hear it from the lips of children. I pray that you receive it with joy and wonder.

I pray that in this season you will remember just how valuable a gift the Christmas Gospel truly is.


