

John 1:5

The light John refers to here is the light of Jesus Christ. We celebrate Jesus' birth during

a time when the days are as brief as they will ever be. But by now the days are starting to grow longer, if only by a minute or two each day. During winter we celebrate the gift of light. Sometimes we can go a week without a sunny day and people's moods darken without being able to see the sun.

We know there is much darkness in our world. The reports of violence in our country and around the world remind daily. Jewish people attacked in Australia around Hanukkah, which is also a festival of light, quickly comes to mind. It's easy, especially this time of year, to focus on the darkness instead of the light. But that is not what Jesus would have us do. January 6th is Epiphany, the day we celebrate the Magi meeting the baby Jesus and his family after their long journey. With their arrival we learn that the light Jesus was bringing into the world wasn't just for the Jewish people, but for people of every tribe and nation.

As I look out my office window this morning the rising sun is shining on the snow and it is sparkling. I see thousands of little points of light. It reminds me that each one of us is like one of those points of light, sent by Jesus to bring His light into this dark world.

Here are a couple examples of how I've seen these points of light in action in the past week.

At a recent church event, something happened that upset one of our young members. Within seconds they were surrounded by three of our Sunday School teachers, who comforted them with words and embraced them in love.

On December 18th we gave out Christmas bags at the Food

Pantry. A woman named Chelsea from the Faith United in Rockwell contacted DelRay M. She wanted to bring coats and other winter supplies for our distribution that day. She brought in a lot of coats and other items. We filled two portable coat racks with them. Diane's experience working in the men's department at Wal-Mart came in handy as we displayed these items. I wasn't sure how much would be taken. But so much of it was gratefully accepted. Among the highlights for me was finding a warm coat for a man who was a veteran and used a walker. Another woman saw the coats and went straight for them. She will be giving birth soon but she found a coat that would fit her. She put it on and didn't take it off. It reminded me of how Mary must have felt when they finally had a place to get in from the cold on the night she gave birth to Jesus. I realized as I helped distribute this unexpected blessing that this moment was my Christmas. How wonderful to help bring warmth and joy to others!
